I don't know that anyone who volunteered to serve on the Hurricane Matthew Disaster Recovery Committee (HMDRC) fully understood the work we would be doing but I want to commend Jeff and Dena Bolles, Johnny and Lynn Smith, Drew and Erin Collier, Lisa Rust and Doug Reedy. The HMDRC meets on a regular basis and is doing an excellent job in providing assistance to individuals and families who were impacted by the storm and flood. I also want to thank the members of the church who have helped friends and neighbors who needed assistance connect

with us. Your encouragement and help has been vital. The work is at an important point and I want to update you as to

what is taking place.

In the weeks after Hurricane Matthew, the church received financial contributions to help families who were impacted by the flood. Many of these donations came from Lumberton natives who no longer live here. They wanted to do something to help their hometown and they wanted their gifts to go directly to those most impacted. There are many good agencies in our community and they are doing good work, but the contributors I talked with gave it to the church in the good faith that we would have minimal overhead expenses and would be able to give assistance directly to the impacted families.

To fulfill this task, the HMDRC organized a mini-grant program. We set the guidelines and prepared an application form. We proceeded to get the word out through the church newsletter and word-of-mouth. I am pleased to share that to date, we have received seventy five grant requests and have approved approximately half of the applications. We are working with the others to get the information needed to make decisions about their grants. Thus far, we have not declined a grant request, but some of the applicants have not fully understood the intent of the program, so we will have to help these folks look for other forms of assistance.

The HMDRC realized at its first meeting that its work would be short-lived. We were tasked with helping people in need as quickly and efficiently as possible and we are well on our way to doing so. I cannot say for sure when we will bring the grant program to a close but given the funds we have available and the number of requests, I believe we will be in the "short-rows" soon. And then...

Preparing for Sunday..."Behind the Law"

Psalm 119:1-8, Matthew 5:21-37

The Psalmist prays to keep the Lord's laws with steadfast devotion (Ps. 119:5). This is a worthy prayer, but in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus pointed out that the law has limits. Keeping the law does not a righteous person make. In our text from Matthew Jesus referred to four laws and then said that keeping these laws was not enough. To live a righteous life one must live not just the letter, but the intent of the law. We must go *Behind the Law* to a relationship with God that honors the dignity and worth of our neighbors.
